PLEASE BE AWARE of UNEXCUSED TARDIES POLICY

We are required to report unexcused tardies to the attendance officer. If a student arrives after 7:45 A.M., the parent must accompany the student to the office and sign the child in the student sign-in book. The teacher is then notified that the student is being admitted to class.

After the fourth tardy, a special parent-administrator conference will be held and all unexcused tardies are reported to the Mississippi Department of Education Office of Compulsory School Attendance Officer.
