We are looking for individuals that can volunteer 1 to 5 days per week for 4 to 20 hours per week. (Mornings).

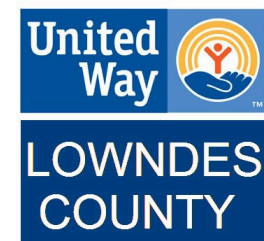

Mission: VIPs will help children in the community develop the academic and life skills that are critical to their development and future successes.

Goal: Each school will have VIPs that will tutor and mentor children in Kindergarten through Fifth Grade. Community churches will support the VIP program by enlisting volunteers, providing transportation if needed, and purchasing school lunches for VIPs that volunteer 4 or more hours a day.

Definition: VIPs are 40 years old or older, in good physical health, and will volunteer to work 4-20 hours a week with Elementary children within the Columbus Municipal School District .

VIP's Role:

Activities included are:

- Reflecting the qualities of a positive role model
- Providing emotional support and assistance in developing basic learning skills
- Reading to children

Activities included are not:

- Serving in staff roles
- Performing clerical or custodial functions
- Serving as babysitters
- Acting as substitute teachers, teacher's aides, group leaders or similar positions
- Supervising children or staff
- Disciplining or punishing children in any way

Do I have to teach skills?

No. The VIP program is designed to develop positive relationships with students. VIPs are role models, mentors, and share a genuine interest in improving the lives of children.
